Dogs For Better Lives recently launched a new program in collaboration with a Texas group called Operation Kindness. It offers the opportunity to identify shelter dogs from Operation Kindness with the ideal temperament and abilities to become service

dogs. Currently the waitlist to obtain a DFBL dog is up to 3 years. The population of shelter dogs in the Pacific Northwest has dwindled since the pandemic making it harder to find suitable dogs here. Shelter dogs that are selected are placed in training programs. By increasing the number of dogs through this program more dogs will be able to be placed. Those that don't graduate are adopted out, benefiting from the additional skills they learned in the program. It sounds like everyone benefits from this partnership.


